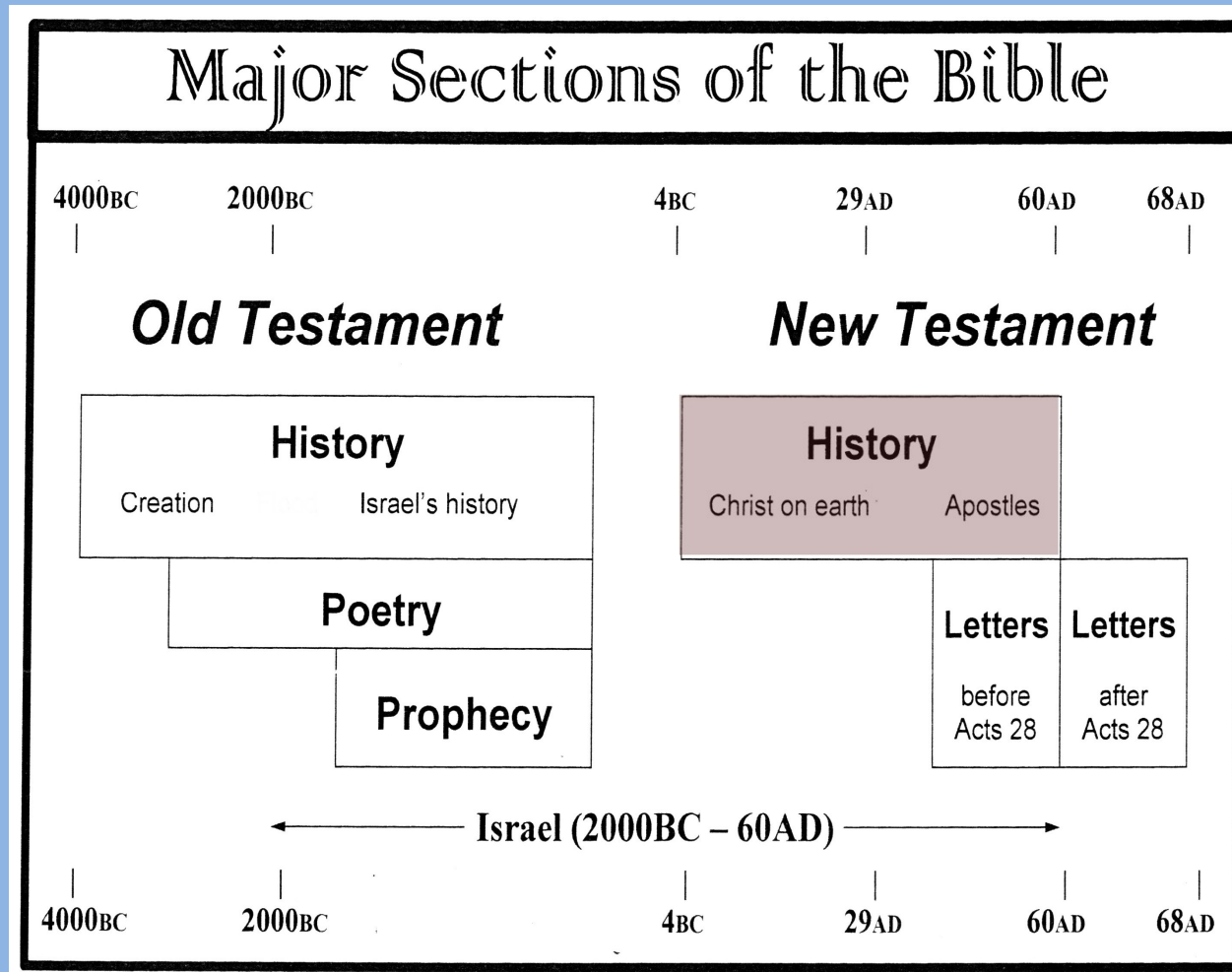

## Interpretation:

*Ask first:*

“What did the verse mean to the people it was written to/about?”

## Application:

*Ask later:*

“How does this verse apply to me?”

## What is a “Gospel?”

**euaggelion: good news**

**Original Word:** εὐαγγέλιον, ου, τό

**Part of Speech:** Noun, Neuter

**Transliteration:** euaggelion

**Phonetic Spelling:** (yoo-ang-ghel'-ee-on)

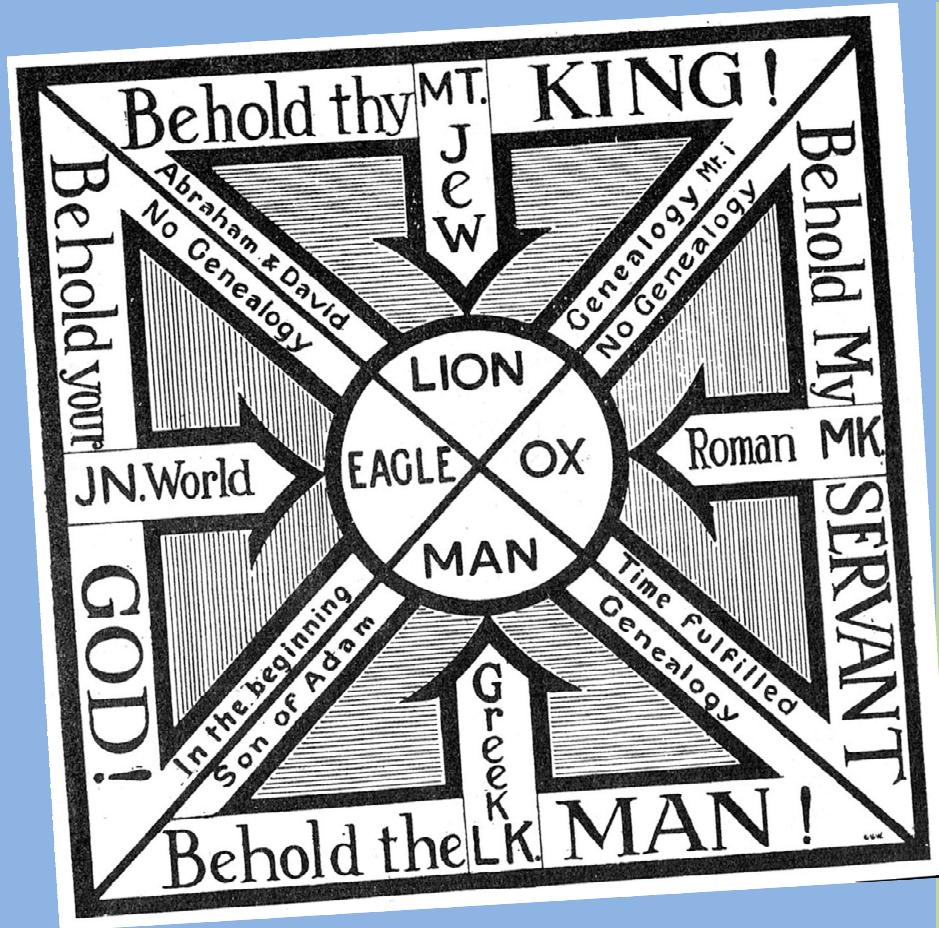
*eu* = “good”

εὐαγγέλιον  
euaggelion

*angel* = message

*euaggelion* =  
**good message**  
**(good news)**
