


#### The Triumphal Entry Into Jerusalem


Matthew 21:1

at the Mount of Olives ..."






Bethphage Bethany

Jerusalem City Gate




"The Golden Gate"

triumphal entry"









The Golden Gate of the temple mount today

The original Golden Gate probably lies in ruins underground today.






The original Golden Gate probably lies in partial ruin underground today.



### Jerusalem's Enemies in Zechariah 9






Zechariah 9:10



### Garments and Branches on the Road

Matthew 21:8

Thus says the Lord: "I have anointed you [Jehu] king over Israel". Then each man hastened to take his garment and put it under him on the top of the steps; and they blew trumpets, saying, "Jehu is king!" 2 Kings 9:12,13





You shall take for yourselves on the first day [of the Feast of Tabernacles] the fruit of beautiful trees, <u>branches of palm trees</u>, the boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook: and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God...

Leviticus 23:40



An exclamation of praise, but with an emphasis on "Please save!"

From the Hebrew words *hoshia anna* = Save, I pray (or "Please save!") contracted to "Hosanna!"

Psalm 118:25 – Save now, I pray, O LORD

The Hebrew names Hosea" and Joshua, and the Greek name Jesus all mean "Jehovah saves".

"You will call His name JESUS, for He will save His people from their sins"

Matthew 1:21



### The Hallel

A collection of six psalms
Psalms 113 to 118
sung particularly at Jewish festivals.

The Levite singers would sing the Hallel psalms during the Feast of Tabernacles. When they reached ...

Psalm 118 verse 25

Save now, I pray, O Lord!



(i.e. the words"Hosanna!" in Hebrew)

... the worshippers would wave branches (in keeping with the theme of that feast being a harvest festival).

A very great multitude ... cut down <u>branches</u> from the trees and spread them on the road ... saying: "<u>Hosanna</u> to the Son of David!" *Matthew 21:8,9*
